The reports show the results achieved by your child in the various standards that they sat in each subject. A reminder that in NCEA, students may have up to three separate standards and results in a subject through exams alone. However in some subjects there may have been only one standard and others have no exams at all (only internal assessment). These exams served as practice for the real thing in November, so the reports give you an indication of how much work needs to be done to get the desired result later in the year. An added bonus in the whole process was that the team went to Wellington to present at the Reserve Bank and while there, met Assistant Governor Mr John McDermott, a former student of our school.
