Final weeks for senior students:- Senior students have less than two weeks of classes left in 2014 as they will be released on study leave on Wednesday, November 5th. Senior students should be on study leave by midday on Nov 5th having completed sign out procedures that morning. The national NCEA exams commence a few days later on Monday 10th November.

At this time of the year things can be very busy and stressful for seniors as they scramble to complete final internal assessments and portfolios that are to be externally assessed. Your support and encouragement is needed at this time more than most other times. While it would be ideal if things had not been left to the last minute, this is the reality that most face in trying to get work in on time and presented to a high standard. On top of this are the looming NCEA exams and the need to get prepared for them by studying.

Vagueness is a prerequisite for most teenagers, a "must have" quality which sets the adults around them into a mild panic at times like this. They appear vague about what assessments are due in and when, about how many credits they already have and how many more they need to pass, and about when their exams are and exactly what is to be tested in them. The common response is "I don't know". If your teenager's vagueness around their learning and achievements to date is alarming you, please contact their Dean for a factual update. Senior students should know:-

- How many credits they have to date, how many are available to achieve this year, how many they can get from the exams and how many they need to get to pass their level. If they don't know they should see their Dean or you can call the Dean.
- When the national NCEA exams are on. The exam timetable is on the NZQA website, on our website and in hard copy for collecting from our Student Reception. Put a copy on your fridge and highlight the exam times for your child. They will need their entry slip for each exam which they will receive on Nov 5th. They must be here at least 20 minutes before the exam starts.
- What standards or coursework are being assessed in the exams. How many papers is that and how much time should be spent on each. Ask their teacher. They will clarify this and it won't be the first time.
- **How to study.** The Year 11s have had a presentation and hand-out on this. Copies of helpful hints are at Student Reception.

Holidays for seniors commence after their last exam. Until that time, they are on study leave from school. While on study leave, students should be at home studying. While some may finish exams earlier than others, they should leave friends alone until they too have finished their last exam.

What's ahead for juniors?- Normal classes continue for Year 9 and 10 students up until Friday, Nov 21st. Junior Exams commence on this date and run through until Wednesday Nov 26th inclusive. These are important exams as they measure achievement to date and can also determine classes for Year 10s going into Year 11 and NCEA and also Year 9s going into Year 10. For Year 10 students these exams contribute significantly to graduation points for the year. Junior students should therefore take these exams seriously and revise for them. The outcomes will be reported on in the end of year report.

Following the Junior Exams, there is just over a week of normal classes which will involve some exam feedback and follow-up time as well as several days of themed learning in Year 9 where each curriculum area works on the same theme in their own way. Year 10 classes will commence preparation for Level 1 NCEA the following year. Three days of different activities are followed by the Junior Prize Giving at 10am on Wednesday, December 10th and the school year ends at 11.00am.

What's ahead in the next two weeks?

- Music Prize Giving, Wednesday 29th Oct. 7pm. Come and enjoy some great music.
- Sports Prize Giving. Thursday 30th Oct. 7.00pm. Come and support our sports successes of 2014.
- Senior Prize Giving. Wednesday Nov 5th. 7.30pm. Come and support our academics.
