The phrase above in both English and Maori, is our school motto. As part of a fresh look at our branding, the Board of Trustees decided to adopt a motto to go with our existing logo and college name. We are currently investigating ways of putting all three together in the form of a new crest or masthead. This is part of a bigger push to get our message out there, to ensure that the community here and further afield know what we are achieving, and what we stand for.

A group of staff and students worked together to decide upon our core values and this is what they arrived at. Many positive behaviours drop out of these values and students and staff are very quickly learning what it means to behave with pride and respect about our school.

We are proud to be part of our school and of our achievements and we respect the differences in ability, ethnicity, gender and age that abound amongst us. Respecting others' right to learn and right to be different, can be a challenge for some but it is a clear expectation of ours. Any students who are prone to distracting others in class or giving put downs, are on a steep learning curve at present, so that they can behave in a way consistent with our motto.
