## Dear Parents, Guardians and Caregivers

Tena koutou katoa.

**Senior Exams and School Holidays:** Exams for senior students commence on Friday, August 8<sup>th</sup> and finish on Wednesday, August 13<sup>th</sup>. These exams are practice external exams (practice for the national exams which are sat in November each year) and the content for papers being sat will have been taught by the time the exams commence, if not already. These exams are important however, for two other reasons. They form a basis for decision making about whether a student would cope with a course in the next level up in 2015, along with a range of internal assessment and other data. They would also be used by us to estimate grades for students who may take ill when the national exams are on in November. We call them the "Entrance Exams" to highlight their value in helping us all make decisions about courses for next year.

Too often students take these exams lightly and live to regret that, as they struggle to get entry to a course that they really wanted. With your help and encouragement, students should set aside time in the upcoming holiday break to prepare for these exams. If they do well, they will be all the better prepared for the real thing at the end of the year and will get to take the course that they wanted. If they struggle, they will know what areas to focus on in preparing for the end of the year and what standard they need to reach. To do no preparation wastes their time and ours. These exams commence in the third week of term so there is little time for preparation after the holidays.

**Courses in 2015:** Following closely after the senior exams comes the process of choosing subjects for next year. Integral to this process is you, the parent, whanau or caregiver and the conversations that you have with your young person. Some have little idea of career pathways that might suit them and might need a lot of support to settle on a couple of broad pathways. Conversations around what they are good at (or not), what they like (or don't), and whether they want to help people and work with people or are happy to work quietly in the background, all help. The closer we can get to choosing a couple of broad pathways, the better the course selection should be.

**Reports:** Reports for seniors will be mailed home by the end of this week. You should receive them over the weekend or early next week. Junior reports (Y9 and Y10) will be posted home by Week 2 next term. Remember that you can log on to the Parent Portal at any time and see up to date achievement data on your child as well as attendance and pastoral data. There will come a time when school reports as we know them will disappear.
