We had a competition at **Ormiston Senior College Saturday 19th.** Glenfield College entered 5 robots. In the preliminary rounds 4 of our robots made the top 8 out of 31 teams (in fact 3 made the top 5). **We had 3 teams qualify for the semifinals and Jason Collingwood qualified for the finals**. Losing 2 matches to 1.
