Robotics Champions

One of our five robotics teams have been awarded the top NZ VEX Robotics prize at the 2015 VEX National Robotics Championships. These championships were held at Vodafone Events Centre in Manukau from the 27th February to 1st March. There were 70 teams competing in two divisions vying for tournament champion and for the highly sort after top prize of the Excellence award. Glenfield College's team 2918A won the Excellence award. They were also overall tournament runners up, Science Division champion and runners up in robot programming. The robot was built and driven by Jason Collingwood and coached by Mark Golds. Jason's programming skills have him sitting at 13th equal in the world wide Vex Robotics rankings for programming.

Other awards won by college teams were Technology Division runners up and the Create award, by team 2918E, built and driven by Hemant Toora and coached by Jayden Kemp. The Technology Division Team 2 2918C built and driven by Cameron Selby and coached by Matthew Steyn won runners up in their division finals. The 2918B built and driven by Levi Chapman was knocked out in the semi-finals by 2918E and 2918C. Levi was coached by Taryn Kemp. 2918D driven and built by Marc Collingwood and coached by Keegan Corbet was knocked out in the quarter finals. The school was also awarded the Educate award for the steps it has taken to integrate robotics into the curriculum.

Academic Mentoring 2015 – Tuesday 17th March

All parents, guardians and caregivers of students in Years 10 to 13 will receive a letter early next week inviting you to book a time to come in with your child on Tuesday 17th March, to discuss and agree on academic goals for 2015. Staff are making themselves available from 8:00am to 12:00pm and 5:00pm to 7:00pm on that day in the hope that you can attend at a time to suit you. We really want as many of you as possible to attend with your child because it is where both home and school are taking an active interest in a student's progress, that they have the best chance of succeeding.

Every student in Years 10 to 13 has a teacher mentor who will be monitoring their progress across all their subjects regularly (fortnightly), so that if a student is not tracking according to goals, a meeting will be held and strategies put in place to correct things.

There will be <u>no classes for any year levels</u> on that day but we do expect all students other than Year 9s to attend their goal setting meeting. Mentors will be able to talk about progress to date based on the Interim Reports due home shortly.

Payment Options

This year we have had many families take the opportunity to pay their subject and user pays fees by Automatic Payment. This is a very simple way to ensure all user based fees are covered by the end of the year. When a confirmation of a payment arrangement is received, then the student will receive their workbooks and materials sooner rather than waiting until all fees are paid.

For a junior student as little as \$5.00 per week from the beginning of the school year will cover all subject fees including workbooks. For a senior student \$10.00 will cover most subject fees and workbooks depending on what subjects have been selected. If your child(ren) play sports, has Music Tuition or has a Senior Camp, then a slightly higher amount will be required to cover those fees.
