




Robotics Team

Remembering Di Hickman

12 November 1942 - 11 February 2018

It is with sadness but also thankfulness that we remember Di Hickman's contribution to the Glenfield College and North Shore community.

Di Hickman was a member of staff at Glenfield College from 1987-2004 with shorter periods on the staff of the college subsequent to this. She taught Science, Chemistry and Physics, mainly in rooms 33 and 34.

She is remembered with fondness by members of the teaching staff, as seen by the number of past and present members of the colleges' Science, Maori, English, Humanities and Counselling departments attending Thursday's memorial service.

As a teacher, her teaching resources were always extremely well prepared and they supported the learning of both the able and the struggling student.

She was remembered for her caring attitude and her preparedness to go the extra mile with her students. One staff member credits her coaching of Chemistry to his daughter as being the thing that got her through her exams. Whether you were a staff member or a student if you asked her for help the answer was always yes.

She was involved with the college's Tiri Tiri Matangi restoration programme, and continued to be active on environmental issues after she left teaching. She learned Maori in her later years and was able to supervise Maori classes at the college. When younger she was a North Shore hockey representative and continued in her support of hockey for many years. Several of our past students who had been involved with her in this way, attended her memorial service on Thursday.

She will be greatly missed.
