Junior End of Year Exams

Our students have completed their end of year exams, and have done themselves, parents, teachers, and our school proud. They have put 100% into studying for, preparing for and completing them. It was amazing to see the students studying for exams during break times in small study groups around the school and making use of the Learning Hub in the Library with staff after school. Great job, Juniors!

Project K

Project K is a special programme designed for year 10 students over the course of 14 months. This program is a way for selected students to develop skills that transcend the classroom. The goal is to see students build confidence to make better choices for themselves and their future. The projected results of this programme have the students making better choices for themselves, including quitting drugs/alcohol, being more involved in school, and feeling included in the community.

The programme is comprised of three modules. First, the students spend three weeks in the wilderness, letting nature act as their teacher. Second, the students will take part in an activity that gives back to the community, encouraging a sense of responsibility for themselves and those around them. Finally, the students will take part in an ongoing mentorship programme. Project K provides well-qualified and highly trained mentors to guide the students as they apply the skills learned in the previous modules to their day to day lives.



During Friday's assembly, Antonia from Project K spoke to our students about the life changing experience the programme provides. Next Tuesday, all Year 9 students will be surveyed as we begin the process of selecting the 12 students to undertake this incredible journey.

The Year 10 boys who were fortunate enough to begin their Project K journey at the start of 2017 were also recognised for their involvement in the programme and for the impressive progress they've made in all areas of their lives. Antonia was presented with a gift from the boys to thank her for all of her hard work and for the difference she's made to their futures.

Project K is free of charge for students thanks to the kind donations made to the Graeme Dingle Foundation.
