

APAC 2017



Glenfield College's Robotics teams represented us at the Asia Pacific Robotics Competition in the Rotorua Energy Events Centre Monday 4 to Thursday 7 December 2017.

There were 200 teams in 6 divisions competing for prizes in VEX EDR robots (metal) VEX IQ (plastic) BDS robots (like K'nex) and Huminoid robots. Glenfield Competed in the VEX EDR division with 80 teams in total.

Our Students designed and built their own robots, programming and driving to achieve a

winning system. Hemant Toora (Driver and Builder) Adam Macintyre (coach) 2918E produced our best winning combination coming 27th in the preliminaries. Our other 4 teams were ranked evenly behind them. Unfortunately, none of our teams were picked for the quarter finals
