



Auckland Maths Olympiad 2018

Six students, accompanied by Sue Higgins HOD Maths, left school early on Saturday morning to compete in this year's Auckland University Maths Olympiad. The students bravely agreed to spend their Saturday facing some very challenging questions. The Maths Building quickly filled up with 200 students from all over Auckland. Lots of striped blazers and lapel badges were on display. Many students were practicing their responses to the questions from previous years and discussing their strategies. The competitors felt a little under-prepared but had agreed that this year the students were going along for the experience, with a mindset that they would be more competitive when they knew more about the competition. After a long wait, the students were ushered into the lecture theatres to begin.

Students attempt 10 questions and are scored from 0-3 on each. They can retry a question and get it marked a second time – but they must raise their hand to request that a question is marked. When the students left the exam room they were all buzzing – checking the responses their friends had made and asking about how many points each student got. After a lot of free pizza, all of the students met in the theatre to see the prizes awarded. This year Glenfield College didn't make the top 15, but with the experience gained they look forward to returning next year. Sue Higgins, HOD Maths.


L2 Biology Trip

On Thursday 10 May, L2 Biology left the college at 9.15 am in two minibuses bound for Long Bay Beach. Their goal was to look at how animals had arranged themselves in relation to low and high tides. Using transit lines and quadrats they analyzed each area of the beach from the low tide mark to the high tide mark. It was wonderful to watch everyone totally focused on gathering data for their project. Mr King and Mrs Hanoosh used their vast Biology knowledge to answer the questions students were asking. Seeing the animals in their natural environment made the topic come alive for the students.



Otago University Visit

Last week a number of senior students took the opportunity of hearing what the University of Otago has to offer. They found out that for all courses only University Entrance is required as selection into restricted courses such as Medicine and Law occurs at the end of the student's first year. NZQA Fees for 2018

Year 11,12 and 13 Students

Must pay the NZQA administration fee to have their credits registered by NZQA in order to receive their National Certificates of Educational Achievement. This is not just a fee for external examinations.

Financial Assistance

Financial Assistance information and application forms are available from Mrs King in the Student Centre. These must be completed and returned indicating eligibility such as low income, community services cardholder, beneficiary etc. Applications must be completed and returned to Mrs King before 10 August 2018.

Payments by Installments

If you need to spread the load, you can start payments earlier in the year to cover NZQA Fees. Automatic payments need to have covered the full NZQA fee by 10 August. Payments can be arranged with the Payment Centre on either a weekly or monthly basis.


