

# SCHOOL NEWS


## Cultural Week 2018

The conference entails students carefully researching their assigned country in preparation for the discussion of five remits, an emergency situation, and impromptu debate, as well as other matters which arose during the two days.



## **Cultural Week in the Learning Support Centre**


