With only 13 school days left until senior students leave for NCEA examinations, a lot of work still needs to be done. As discussed with the school at the assembly on Tuesday, the school year is like a marathon and they are all approaching the finish line. This is not the time to stumble and fall. A reminder about Sports and Trip Fees

A reminder that all 2018 Sports fees should now be paid for. These are compulsory fees, which means they are required to be paid. The amount we charge covers the cost of the Sporting Organisations Registration fee.

Uniform Hire and Transport where applicable. We wish for as many Students as possible to be involved in some sporting activity during the year but non-payment of Sports fees may result in Students not being able to participate.

Many Junior Teams are now practicing for the Term 4 Sports with some already starting their competitions so these are now due for payment.

Trips fees and material based costs are outstanding for a number of Senior and Junior Students.

Any of these fees outstanding at the end of the year for Juniors will be rolled over into the 2019 year for payment. Seniors will need to have these paid before leaving on Exam Study or contact the Finance Office to

make arrangements otherwise, they will be required to be paid on the Senior Checkout Day.

From next year, Students who have not made payment for trips or made payment arrangements may find that they will be retained at School. Those left behind will be given similar work so that they may gain the same understanding and learning as if they had attended the trip.

We have a number of families who have set up Automatic Payments to clear any School-related costs and have found this a great way of ensuring all of the School Related charges are covered. It could be as little as \$5.00 per week or, if your child(ren) are actively involved in Sport, then \$15.00 per week may be more suitable. Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease

Anyone can get Hand, Foot and Mouth disease, but it is most common in children under 10. If your child has Hand, Foot, and Mouth disease, they'll have painful sores in their mouth and a rash with blisters on their hands and feet.

Human Hand, foot, and mouth disease are not related to foot and mouth disease in animals.

If you have contact with hand, foot and mouth disease while you're pregnant, or if you develop any kind of rash, see your doctor or lead maternity carer – just to be safe.

Mild fever is usually the first sign of Hand, Foot and Mouth disease. This starts 3–5 days after your child has been exposed to the disease.

After the fever starts, your child may develop other symptoms, including:

- painful red blisters on their tongue, mouth, palms of their hands, or soles of their feet
- · loss of appetite
- a sore throat and mouth
- a general feeling of weakness or tiredness.
- The disease is usually mild and lasts 3–7 days.

The only medicine recommended for Hand, Foot and Mouth disease is paracetamol.

Most blisters disappear without causing problems. In the mouth, however, some may form shallow, painful sores that look similar to cold sores. If your child's mouth is sore, don't give them sour, salty or spicy foods.

- Make sure they drink plenty of liquids to avoid getting dehydrated.
- Call Healthline 0800 611 116 if you are unsure what you should do.

How Hand, Foot and Mouth disease is spread

Hand, foot and mouth disease is spread by coughing or sneezing, or by contact with mucus, saliva, blisters or the bowel movements of an infected person.

Children are contagious ('catching') for around 7–10 days.

Keep your child home from childcare or school until blisters have dried. If blisters are able to be covered and the child is feeling well, they will not need to be excluded.

- Frequent hand washing helps decrease the chance of becoming infected.
- Staying away from others who have the disease and not sharing toys during the infection also helps prevent the disease.
