The key message to our students and community is that our expectations, hopes and determination to fulfill our potential is the same as what it was on Wednesday. 30th

January when students started the school year.

There are a lot of challenges in society currently and one of these is bullying/cyberbullying. I spoke about this to the students at assembly on Tuesday and my message was simple:

- 1. Bullying exists and we deal with it
- 2. We have a zero tolerance for bullying
- 3. Most importantly, what to do and how to support others to ensure bullying does not occur within Glenfield College moving forward.

Also, currently in the media, there is a lot of discussion in regard to the legalisation of cannabis. From the perspective of being Principal of this school, I can see no benefit whatsoever in opening the gates and making cannabis more available to teenagers. There is no doubt the impact that cannabis use has on the developing brain is detrimental and can lead to significant health issues in later life. Full House for Glenfield College Talent Finale




