The conference involves students carefully researching their assigned country in preparation for the discussion of five remits, an emergency situation and impromptu debate, as well as other matters which arise during the two days. Geology Trip to Rotorua was Educational



Our Level 1 Geography students visited Rotorua last week. The students started by rolling down the Ogo Zorbs and then went up to the Luge. While up the luge, the students started their fieldwork, focusing on the ways that the tourist industry is protecting the land and culture of Rotorua and Aotearoa, New Zealand. This was even more evident during the Tamaki Maori Cultural Village experience that evening. They also explored the Wai-O-Tapu Thermal Lakes and then headed over to the Polynesian Spa to soak in the geothermal springs. Measles in Auckland Schools

There is currently a measles outbreak in Auckland, with five documented cases on the North Shore. There are no known cases at Glenfield College but we have been asked by the Auckland Regional Public Health Service to share this information with you, as a precaution.

Measles is very easy to get, and can cause serious brain damage, or even death. It is especially serious for young children, pregnant women, and anyone with a weakened immune system. Symptoms include a cough, runny nose, sore eyes, sore throat, fever,skin rash, aching muscles, tiredness, loss of appetite, diarrhoea, dry cough, headache, sensitivity to light and swollen lymph nodes.

Advice from the Auckland Regional Public Health Service is to check your child's immunity, which they will have either from a MMR vaccination, a previous measles diagnosis or a blood test. If they are not immune, then the Health Service advise that they should have one MMR vaccination immediately to protect them.

Measles in Auckland schools

Please vaccinate your child or young person if they have not had one measles (MMR) vaccine. It is free at your GP.

Students in a class with someone who has measles may be asked to stay home for one to two weeks, if they have had no MMR vaccinations.

Students with one or more MMR vaccinations can still attend school.

Check your child's immunisation records in their Well Child/Tamariki Ora book or ring your GP clinic.

Tell your GP or after hours clinic if you suspect measles before you arrive, so you don't infect others.

<u>Symptoms</u>: cough, runny nose, fever, sore red eyes, then a rash.

If you have already paid, then the Finance Office will be in contact with you soon with further details.


Please note the International NZQA fee is still required for International Students and will need to be paid by the end of August.
