Message from the Principal

As we come to the end of Term 1 of 2022, I'd like to congratulate the Glenfield College community for the way we have navigated the past 11 weeks. As stated at the assemblies yesterday and today, it really has been all about reconnecting and re-engaging after the recent challenges presented by Covid-19. We are very, very proud of our achievements so far this year and the fact that we have maintained an average 84% attendance during the recent Omicron outbreak has been pleasing.

New staff to the school have been a welcome addition this year and there are many things that we have been able to celebrate so far, including the Honours and Leadership Ceremonies, the launch of the House Competition for 2022 and most recently, Athletics Day, which was a resounding success.

I would also like to make special mention of Mr Gardner and the mentoring programme which has been transformed this year. As stated to the students, our mentoring programme, incorporating with MyMahi, has never been so structured and well-suited to meet the needs of our students, particularly those in Years 11 to 13. In many ways, this programme is best summed up through one word - "relationships" - connections between the mentor and the mentee (teacher and student).

Mrs Smith has also had a lot of success in the last few weeks facilitating the Learning Hub (homework programme) which occurs on Tuesdays and Thursdays after school. When I visit the Learning Hub between 3.30pm and 4.30pm and see our staff members working with many students, I am reminded of how lucky our students are with the staff at Glenfield College. In many schools, families would need to pay for after-school tutoring at off-site facilities, but our staff willingly give up their time to help. We look forward to building on this as "the rubber hits the road" with the students' academic studies.

The final key message to students at recent assemblies has been about the fact that in Term 2, we are resetting and recalibrating our values and expectations. We have used Term 1 to reconnect and reengage students back into school after the lockdowns of the previous year. Term 2 needs to be about returning to our high standards. We ask parents to support us with the return to high uniform standards (clean-shaven faces, hair tied up etc.). We want students to display our values of pride and respect while wearing our uniform.

Finally, I wish you a very safe holiday. I look forward to seeing many of you at the Mother's Day breakfast on the second Monday of Term 2 and I also wish the 30 students and staff members attending OPC during the holidays, as well as the students and staff going to Rotorua all the very best.


Leadership Assembly



Whanau Awhina Plunket online Babysitting Course

Plunket Education in Schools' Babysitting Course is available for teenagers all over Aotearoa.

This course is designed to give high school students the knowledge and skills to babysit children of all ages. It's written for first time babysitters; students don't need to have previous experience to enrol.

The course ideal for students aged 14 and above and takes around 2-3 hours to complete.

Students work through nine sequential modules and on completion of the course and the final quiz will receive a certificate certified by Whanau Awhina Plunket to show employers that they have completed this course and are ready to babysit. As well as the certificate the students are sent a Babysitter's Manual that supports all the information they have learned in the course.

During the course the following topics are covered:

- the role of the babysitter, including the expectations of the families you are working for
- ages and stages of children from birth to school age, their basic needs and their care
- professional behaviour including your presentation
- how to engage with children of different ages, including activities for each age group and behavioural information
- safety, including emergency situations, keeping yourself and the children safe, and basic first aid
- how to get a babysitting job.
