Covid-19 Information

The well-being of our students and staff is very important to us. We are aware that along with Covid, the winter bugs are also doing the rounds. If your child has returned to school post-illness but still has a leftover symptom, could we ask that they wear a mask to protect the health of those around them. If your child becomes unwell at school...

Thank you for keeping your child at home if they have any COVID symptoms. Common COVID Omicron symptoms for teenagers are a sore stomach, sometimes with nausea, diarrhea and vomiting, instead of or as well as coughs & sore throat etc. If they have any of these symptoms, please keep your child home even if they test negative as RAT results are not always reliable. Several students have now tested positive twice for Omicron recently. The gastro symptoms are also symptoms for Norovirus and Influenza A, both of which we currently have at school.

If your child or a family member tests positive, please use the link on our school website to let us know, so we know we have the correct information.

Until last week, you did not have to isolate again, if a family member tested positive within 90 days of your testing positive. From last week, this has been reduced to 29 days, because the new Omicron variants are highly transmissible.

If your child phones you during school hours to let you know they are sick and want to go home, please remind them to follow school rules and go to the sickbay, where we will look after them and contact you as necessary. It helps us to know where they are, and that they are safe.


