

"I had the philosophy of saying, 'anything one idiot can do I can do as well'."

Bruce, you are an exceptional person who, as per the Māori proverb above, has contributed so much to society. We thank you for sharing your stories with us and reminding us of the importance of good old values, the importance of mindset, hard work and believing in ourselves.

Level 1 Geography Camp




On the 18th & 19th of May, our Year 11 Geography students took a trip to the Waitomo Caves to learn about the impacts that tourism has had on the three caves in the area, - the Ruakuri, Aranui and Glowworm caves which have been open for 130ish years for touring.

The Geography students participated in two cave tours of the Ruakuri Cave and the Glowworm Cave, each vastly different. The Ruakuri started with a walk down the artificial spiral entry, before entering the actual cave itself. The Glowworm Cave tour ended with a short boat ride under the glowworms and their shimmering lights. We learnt about speleothems (cave formations), the history of each cave, and the life cycle of a glowworm. A highlight was the two-hour black water rafting Black 'Labyrinth course'. This involved tubing down the river inside of the cave in the cold, cave water. The gourmet dinner provided by Mr Feast was much appreciated after the numbing of fingers.

Important Information: Road Works Affecting the School -

Major roadworks began on Monday, 22 May and will continue for the duration of the 2023 year.


Of note is the stretch of Kaipatiki Road between the Stanley Road roundabout and the Easton Park Parade roundabout where one lane only will be in use. Cars will only be able to travel TOWARDS Glenfield.

Please consider this information and discuss with your children alternate drop-off and pick-up points and locations for bus travel.

Scenarios to consider are:

- 1. Kaipatiki Road, heading down the hill from the Glenfield Mall end, may become a bottleneck of traffic with cars only being able to turn right into Easton Park Parade or go around the roundabout and head back up Kaipatiki Road. You might like to consider choosing an alternative and safer place to drop off and collect your children from school.
- 2. The bus stop outside the tennis courts in the afternoons will not be operational. Students will need to walk to the bus stop opposite The Orchards Retirement Home on Stanley Road where the buses have been re-routed to.
- 3. For the safety of your children, please remind them to follow marked crossings on Kaipatiki Road during this time.

Students Driving to School

We want to continue to ensure our students are kept safe when they are making their way to Glenfield College. It is a requirement that we are aware of any students who are driving to and from our school each day. If your child drives a vehicle to school, can you please either fill out the digital form below by clicking on the link, or ask your child to collect a permission form from Mrs Newton in reception and return it to school with your child. It should only take you a few minutes. Please fill out this form even if you have completed this in previous years, as we need to have the most up-to-date records at the school. Your child will be issued a Glenfield College parking pass so that if they park on our top driveway we are aware of their car and can find them if need be. Please note that the top driveway is a shared space with Glenfield Rugby Club, and the Wilson and Wairau students also use this driveway. The privilege of driving to school comes with an expectation that your child will drive responsibly and will not carry illegal passengers. Digital permission to bring a vehicle to school is linked here. it is mandatory your child has a parking pass if they are going to be driving to school from this term.

Devices Compulsory for Years 9 and 10

Just as a reminder to all Year 9 and 10 students, you are expected to have a Chromebook or equivalent for all lessons every day. If you have difficulties with this, then please contact your Dean to discuss how we can assist. If your device is broken or is out of battery then there are a limited amount of devices available at the Sports Coordinators' office but these should only be borrowed for the day.



Safety when leaving the School

A reminder for parents that the gates are closed for pickup of students at the end of the day. This is for the safety of those students leaving at 3.10pm. Please arrange to collect your child further up Kaipatiki Road, either near the rugby club or towards our netball courts. If you are leaving the school through the main gates then you should turn left as this is the safest, and quickest way to exit. If you need to head up Kaipatiki Road, then go around the roundabout and head towards Glenfield Mall.


