**Message from the Principal**

#### **Sports Report**





Both Junior Boys & Junior Girls Volleyball headed off to the Junior Auckland Volleyball Championships midway through Term 4. A competition featuring schools from all over the super-city. The first two days of pool play saw teams graded into three divisions, with the Boys narrowly missing out on qualifying for Division 1. They re-grouped however, and made a run right through to the Semi-Finals, where they unfortunately came unstuck against Long Bay, eventually finishing 4th in Division 2, and 20th in Auckland. The Girls faced a tough pool and qualified for Division 3, where they made a run through to the Quarterfinals, before eventually placing 7th in Division 3.

The Junior Boys followed up a week later, heading to the Junior North Islands Volleyball Championships. A four-day tournament was held again at Bruce Pulman Arena in Takanini. This time, they placed in Division 3 due to it being a first-time entry, more than holding their own against high-level opposition. After a dominant pool stage, in which they placed 1st, including overcoming rivals Long Bay, a Quarterfinal crossover against a very strong Wellington College, saw Glenfield on the wrong side of a nail-biting three-set classic, before ending up placing 7th in the Division.

Futsal fell victim to the weather in Week 6 due to the hall flooding, meaning a revised schedule. However, as we move into the final week of competition, there are Glenfield teams in the final, the Bronze match, and the 5th & 6th play-off! Certainly, this was a successful first iteration of the school's Futsal programme.




