YEAR 11 REQUIREMENTS

Compulsory Courses at Year 11

- English
- Mathematics
- 4 other subjects

NCEA Level 1 Certificate

- 20 credit co-requisite to meet Literacy and Numeracy requirements
- 60 credits at Level 1 or higher

YEAR 12 REQUIREMENTS

Compulsory Courses at Year 12

- Any 6 subjects

Subject selection must be approved by relevant HOD

NCEA Level 2 Certificate

- 60 credits at Level 2 or higher
- 20 credits from the Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy co-requisite

YEAR 13 REQUIREMENTS + UNI ENTRANCE

Compulsory Courses at Year 13

- Any 5 or 6 subjects
- A study period may be approved at this level

Subject selection must be approved by relevant HOD and will be based on academic capability.

NCEA Level 3 Certificate

- 60 credits at Level 3
- 20 credits from the Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy co-requisite

University Entrance

- NČEA Level 3

With the addition of:

 At least 14 credits at Level 3 in 3 approved subjects (remaining credits can come from any subject)
