Compulsory Courses at Year 11

- Science (Highly recommended)
- 4 other subjects

Glenfield College Foundation Certificate

- 20 credit co-requisite to meet Literacy and Numeracy requirements
- 60 credits (Level 1 NCEA & GCFC assessments)

YEAR 12 REQUIREMENTS

Compulsory Courses at Year 12

- English
- 5 other subjects

NCEA Level 2 Certificate

- 60 credits at Level 2 or higher
- 20 credits from the Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy co-requisite

YEAR 13 REQUIREMENTS + UNI ENTRANCE

Course requirements at Year 13

- Any 5 or 6 subjects
- A study period may be approved at this level

Subject selection must be approved by relevant HOD and will be based on academic capability.

NCEA Level 3 Certificate

- 60 credits at Level 3
- 20 credits from the Level 1 Literacy and Numeracy co-requisite

University Entrance

- NCEA Level 3 plus...
- 10 UE Reading and Writing credits

With the addition of:

- At least 14 credits at Level 3 in 3 approved subjects

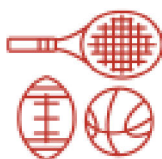


Overview

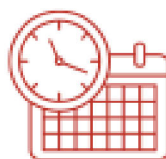
Glenfield College junior students will be eligible to be awarded a certificate at the end of Year 9 and 10. To reflect the importance of a well-rounded education, the certificate will have components that include:

To reflect the endorsements in NCEA the certificates will be awarded and endorsed as Achieved, Merit and Excellence.

The certificate places emphasis on a well-rounded education in the junior school. It will encourage students not only to strive towards academic achievement, but also to put in effort, set high self expectations and be involved in diverse extracurricular experiences. This balanced approach will equip our learners to thrive academically, socially, and emotionally, preparing them for the challenges and opportunities they'll encounter in the senior school.

The components of each certificate are shown over the page. Two certificates will be awarded at the end of each year to eligible students:

- End Of Year 9 Certificate (with Achieved, Merit or Excellence)
- End Of Year 10 Certificate (with Achieved, Merit or Excellence)

End of Year 9 Certificate

SUBJECTS



- Students will study 6 subjects.
- English and Mathematics are compulsory. Science is **highly recommended**.
- Subjects are considered Achievement Standard (AS) or Unit Standard (US). **All** subjects contribute towards gaining the GCFC.

TYPES OF COURSES



Achievement Standard (AS)

- 3 Assessments. 1 formal NCEA and 2 GC.
- Grades awarded range from: Not Achieved, Achieved, Merit and Excellence.

Unit Standard (US)

- Guided by industry using assessments designed by Industry Training Organisations (ITOs)
- Grades awarded at a Not Achieved or Achieved level

ASSESSMENTS & EXAMS



- Students will be assessed via internal assessments and examinations
- AS subjects will offer 3 assessment opportunities with US subjects generally offering more.

CREDITS



- One assessment opportunity in AS subjects will count toward NCEA Level 1 credits. Remaining assessments gain Glenfield College credits.
- A combination of all credits awarded will be used to formalise the level at which the GCFC has been gained.
- Level 1 subjects generally offer 15 credits (NCEA or GC)

OBTAINMENT & ENDORSEMENTS



- Learners require 60 credits (NCEA or GC) to gain the GCFC.
- The GCFC will acknowledge if this has been obtained with or without the Literacy and Numeracy Corequisites.
- 50+ credits at Merit or Excellence, as well as the Literacy and Numeracy Corequisites, will indicate that a student has attained the GCFC with endorsement.
